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(8) Attend all meetings of the Council and its committees except when the Council is conducting his or her official duties, with the right to take part in discussions, but without power to vote.

(9) Recommend to the Council the adoption of such resolutions and bills as he or she considers necessary or appropriate.

(10) Make investigations into:

(1) The affairs of the City;

(2) Cases, except as otherwise provided by subsection 3, any department or division of the City;

(3) Any contract; or

(4) The proper performance of any obligation owed to the City.

(11) Prepare and submit to the Council the annual budget.

(12) Keep the Council fully informed as to the financial condition and needs of the City.

(13) Submit to the Council, at least once each month, a summary of all debts and bills approved for payment by him or her.

(14) Not engage in any other business or occupation without the approval of the City Council.

(15) Perform such other duties as prescribed by this Charter or be required by ordinance or resolution of the Council.

7. The City Manager shall establish his or her residence within the City within 90 days after his or her appointment, unless the period is extended by the Council. He or she shall reside in the City during his or her term of office.

8. He shall not have and shall cause the City Manager to make investigations into the Municipal Court, except
