Approval of this Amendment No. 7 will provide for the purchase of licenses, Session Works Judge License for Civil, Criminal and Family Courts).


The following are the pertinent provisions of the contract:



**Clark County Child Fatalities & Near Fatalities
Where Child or Family Had Prior CCDFS Involvement**



NRS 200.485 Battery which constitutes domestic violence: Penalties; referring child counseling; restriction against dismissal, probation and suspension; definitions.

1. Unless a greater penalty is provided pursuant to subsection 2 or NRS 200.481, a person convicted of a battery which constitutes domestic violence pursuant to NRS 33.018:

(a) For the first offense within 7 years, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to:

(1) Imprisonment in the city or county jail or detention facility for not less than 2 days, but more than 6 months; and

(2) Perform not less than 48 hours, but not more than 120 hours, of community service.

➡ The person shall be further punished by a fine of not less than \$200, but not more than \$1,000. A term of imprisonment imposed pursuant to this paragraph may be served intermittently at the discretion of the judge or justice of the peace, except that each period of confinement must be not less than consecutive hours and must occur at a time when the person is not required to be at his or her place of employment or on a weekend.

(b) For the second offense within 7 years, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to:

(1) Imprisonment in the city or county jail or detention facility for not less than 10 days, but more than 6 months; and

(2) Perform not less than 100 hours, but not more than 200 hours, of community service.
