## A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CLOSING THE ONLINE SALES TAX LOOPHOLE

**Whereas**, the City of Sparks, Nevada has joined with other cities in Nevada to participate in the National City Council Meeting to call attention to issues of municipal concern; and

**Therefore be it Resolved** that the City of Sparks, Nevada, as part of the National City Council Meeting, urges Congress to pass legislation similar to the Remote Transactions Parity Act (H.R. 2775) or the Market Fairness Act of 2015 (S. 698) and
