Subject: Staff Report (For Possible Action): Approval of a Consulting Agreement for

Construction Management Services with CDMSmith for the Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility (TMWRF) Electrical Systems Upgrade Phase II Project in an amount not to exceed \$398,650.00, with the

City of Reno's portion being \$273,593.50 (Sewer Enterprise Fund).

Summary: Construction management services are required for the Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility (TMWRF) Electrical System Upgrade Phase II Project. This scope of work will provide construction management services during project construction that includes construction management, engineering services during construction, inspection, and testing. Staff recommends Council approval of the consultant agreement with CDMSmith for construction management services for the TMWRF Electrical System Upgrade Phase II Project in an amount not to exceed \$398,650.00, with the City of Reno's portion being \$273,593.50 (Sewer Enterprise Fund).

Previous Council Action:

August 22, 2012: Council approved a consulting agreement with CDMSmith for engineering services in support of the design of the Phase II electrical distribution system upgrades in the amount of \$455,480.00 with the City of Reno's portion being \$312,595.92 (Sewer Enterprise Fund).

November 6, 2013: Council approved an amendment for professional engineering services with CDMSmith for engineering services in support of the Design of Phase II improvements to the Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility's (TMWRF) Electrical Distribution System in the amount of \$274,190.00 with the City of Reno's portion being \$188,176.60 (Sewer Enterprise Funds).

Background:

An arc-flash study of the 1964-vintage electrical system components at TMWRF, determined serious hazards existed due to aging, environmental factors and system reliability. The schedule of funding dictated that the electrical upgrades to correct all arc flash hazards be divided into two phases, Phase I and II. The first phase of electrical system upgrades was designed by CDMSmith and constructed by Auburn Construction with completion last summer. Design of the Phase II improvements has now been completed.

The previous authorized design work has resulted in the final design of Phase II electrical improvements that when constructed will reduce arc-flash hazards, update electrical equipment that is at the end of its useful service life, provide electrical system redundancy to improve reliability of the plant to continuously treat sewage and meet discharge permit requirements.

The Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility (TMWRF) is jointly owned by the Cities of Reno and Sparks. The City of Reno oversees the Capital Improvement Program for TMWRF, while the City of Sparks manages operations.

Discussion: This consultant agreement will provide construction management services during project construction that includes construction management, engineering services during construction, inspection, and testing. CDMSmith was selected from the City's approved list of engineering consultants. A recommendation for construction contract award for this project will also be presented to Council on August 27, 2014, as a separate, but related item.

Financial Implications: The City of Reno will administer the agreement and will be reimbursed for a portion of the costs by the City of Sparks through the current cost sharing agreement for TMWRF operation and maintenance. The City of Reno and the City of Sparks share the cost of this project as follows: 68.63% for Reno and 31.37% for Sparks, as shown in Table 1. Costs for the City of Reno are budgeted in the Sewer Enterprise Fund. This project is included in the TMWRF FY2014 Capital Improvement Plan that was approved by the TMWRF Joint Coordinating Committee (JCC).

Legal Implications: The agreement was prepared by the Office of the City Attorney.

Recommendation: Staff recommends Council approve the Agreement for construction period services with CDMSmith for service as described in the attached proposal in an amount not to exceed \$398,650.00 (Reno's share being \$273,593.50 from the Sewer Enterprise Fund) and authorize the Mayor to execute the attached Agreement.
