WHEREAS, these bicycling activities and attractions have great potential to have a positive impact on the City of Sparks' economy and tourism industry and to stimulate economic development by making the region attractive to businesses and citizens who enjoy the out of doors and healthy lifestyles; and

WHEREAS, May has been declared National Bike Month for the last 57 years, and is so again in 2013, and April 29 to May 3 has been declared National Air Quality Awareness Week.
