Reno Spaghetti Bowl

- Spaghetti Bowl originally constructed between 1969 and 1971 for population of 130,000
- Population now about 420,000
- Washoe County has a forecasted growth rate exceeding state and national averages

- Completed 2020, 2030, 2040 models




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PROJECT STUDY LIMITS

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Project Purpose:


• To accommodate the current and future travel demands, and improve safety.

- Develop a project that meets future regional transportation needs



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NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT (NEPA)

- NEPA is the law requiring federal agencies (FHWA) to assess the environmental effects of a proposed project prior to making decisions
- NEPA establishes a framework for environmental review and ensures public and agency participation in the process
- The NEPA process is intended to help agencies make decisions that consider environmental consequences and avoid, minimize, or mitigate environmental impact

WHAT WILL THE EIS INCLUDE?



- Purpose and need for the project
- Range of alternatives; put forward one or more alternatives, including a No-Build alternative, for detailed study
- Existing environmental conditions
- Potential project impacts and how they can be avoided, minimized, or mitigated
- Public and agency involvement



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NDOT/SPARKS COORDINATION GOALS




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- Facilitate open and timely exchange of information between the project team and the City of Sparks about the project, its potential impacts, and appropriate mitigation.
- To resolve unavoidable negative effects this project may have on Sparks, and to maximize land ownership and socioeconomic benefits to Sparks.
- To achieve compliance with legally required steps under federal and state laws, orders, and regulations.
- To obtain Sparks concurrence with the preferred alternative.
