Increasing fund balance in an enterprise fund for development services	Current statue calls for decreasing permit fees if working capital in the enterprise fund is higher than 50 percent of operating and capital expenses for two consecutive years. Increasing the working capital limit could provide more in reserves during economic downturns.			X

Removing the tentative budget preparation process and public hearing	<p>Current statue call for submitting a “tentative” budget, and holding a hearing on a tentative budget on a date and time specific. The tentative budget preparation (NRS 354.5965) is inefficient and does not provide a useful tool for local governments. Additionally, the public hearing on the tentative budget (NRS 354.596) is not timely, as the final budget usurps the tentative budget.</p> <p>Consideration could also be given to adding a provision on a public hearing for final budget, which is currently not required.</p>			X
