About CHA

- Non-profit tax-exempt organization in Northern Nevada
- Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)
- Offers high quality health care to any member of the community, regardless of their ability to pay
- Provides medical, dental and behavioral health care services
- Manages many specialty programs focused on community outreach, engagement and education

Mission and Vision

- Mission: To provide quality, affordable, comprehensive health services to all.
- ➤ Vision: To deliver compassionate, high-quality, affordable health care; serve and advocate for those who are poor and disenfranchised: and partner with others in the communities we serve to improve the quality of life.

Patient-Centered Medical Home

- Three Health Centers have National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) Level 2 —
 - Wells Avenue Medical/Dental Center
 - Neil Road Health Center
 - Sun Valley Health Center
- ➤ PCMHs provide higher quality, more patientcentered, and efficient care through several key functions, we call Patient Engagement (PE):
 - Preventive care support
 - Care coordination
 - Self-management support
 - Population health support
- ➤ Each of the key functions involves the coordinated involvement of multiple members of the direct care team.
- Still developing the resources necessary to fully staff and implement PE.

- Team Care Medicine Approach at all CHA centers
- Allows us to provide our patients with more-focused care while allowing us to increase:
 - Revenue
 - Productivity
 - Patient experience
 - Provider experience
 - Staff experience

- ➤ 50 licensed clinical professionals, including:
 - 22 medical providers (Physicians, APRNs, RNs and PAs)
 - 4 behavioral health providers (LCSW, PhD, Psych APRN)
 - 10 dentists
 - 6 dental hygienists
 - 6 pharmacists
 - 2 registered dietitians

Behavioral Health Services

- ➤ Integrating behavioral health into primary care
- Address unhealthy lifestyle habits including:
 - Smoking, overeating, substance abuse issues, etc.
- Direct impact on a patient's physical condition
- ➤ Brief interventions and full psychotherapy sessions
- >Interventions used:
 - Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT)/ Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), or Dialectal Behavioral Therapy (DBT).

Dental Services

- ➤ Our expert dental team provides:
 - Preventative Care
 - Routine Cleanings
 - Restorative Dentistry
 - Extractions
 - Root canals
 - Sealants
 - Varnishes
 - X-ray
- > Wells Ave. Medical/Dental Center
 - Serves all ages
 - 17 dental suites in a fixed site location
- Children's Mobile Dental Care
 - Serves children 18 and younger
 - 3-chair mobile; travels to 10 locations






Hospital Dental Program

- Provides oral health care to children and disabled adults with severe dental needs
- > Treats patients in a hospital setting under general anesthesia
- Certain challenges may require dental patients to be treated in a hospital setting using general anesthesia.
 - These challenges may include:
 - o Age
 - Behavior management
 - Medical status
 - Developmental limitations
 - o Special needs
 - o Extensive dental work



Cavity Prevention Program

- Mobile school-based program
- Serves all second grade students enrolled in Washoe County schools that receive Title 1 assistance.
- Second graders are targeted due to the eruption of the first molars at 7-8 years old.
- Offers free:
 - Oral health screenings
 - Preventive sealants
 - Fluoride applications
 - Oral hygiene education
 - Nutrition counseling
- > Through the program, a licensed professional travels to the schools and examines each child individually.
- ➢ In 2014, the Cavity Prevention Program visited 24 schools and screened 1,771 second graders.



NNDHP



- Partners with CHA to help administer charity dental programs
- Provides more than \$4 million in dental services to 3,500 children and veterans



Healthy Smile Healthy Child

- Serves children 18 & younger who are on Medicaid, Nevada Check Up or are uninsured
- ≥3,000+ children have been cared for
- ➤ No-cost to low cost



Adopt A Vet Dental Program

- Serves low-income veterans who don't qualify for VA dental services
- > 500+ veterans have been cared for
- Pro-bono dental care with low commitment fee

Homeless Services

- > We serve homeless patients at all 6 of our health centers
- > Homeless patients are eligible for free services including:
 - Primary medical care
 - Immunizations
 - Lab services
 - Family planning services
 - Prescriptions (if filled at CHA Pharmacy at Wells Avenue)
 - Dental services
 - Generally limited to pain and palliative care (e.g. extractions)
 - Can access patients needs fund for preventative and restorative care for children and youth in critical need
 - Behavioral health services
 - Partnership with Children's Cabinet for services
 - o Able to refer patients to clinicians at CHA health centers

Payment Options

- >CHA health centers are not free clinics; however homeless patients are eligible for free services.
- Medicaid, Nevada Check Up and many other private insurances are accepted.
- > Patients have a payment plan option.
- ➤ Patients are also eligible to apply for sliding fee discount based on income and household size.
 - To apply patients need:
 - o Government issued identification
 - o Proof of residency (i.e. utility bill)
 - o Proof of income (i.e. pay stub)



School-Based Health Center

Providing convenient quality care for students and their families from six schools:

 - Physical Exams
 - > Immunizations
 - Wellness Counseling
 - Care of Acute and Chronic Illness
 - > Asthma Management

Women, Infants and Children Nutrition (WIC) Program

- ➤ Ten locations in Reno, Sparks and the North Valleys
- Ronald McDonald Care Mobile
- Healthy food
- Nutrition counseling
- > Fluoride varnish
- Breastfeeding support
- >Low-cost car seats
- Help finding a physician or dentist



Exchange Enrollment Facilitators (EEF) Program

Exchange Enrollment Facilitators:

- Connects patients with available resources
- Provides patients with case management services
- Helps patients apply and enroll for insurance and Medicaid



Pediatric Nutrition Counseling Program

- >CHA offers free nutrition counseling services to patients.
- ➤ Serves children ages 5-18; children under 5 years can be seen by the WIC Registered Dieticians.
- Some conditions children are referred to the program for are:
 - Obesity: >95th percentile BMI for age
 - Underweight: <5th percentile BMI for age
 - Failure to Thrive
 - Abnormal Lipid Profiles
 - Diabetes/Pre-diabetes
 - Severe food allergies
 - Inborn error of metabolism/Congenital metabolic disease

Reach Out & Read*

Reach Out & Read

- Reach Out & Read® prepares America's youngest children to succeed in school by partnering with doctors to prescribe books and encourage families to read together.
- During regular pediatric checkups, Reach Out and Read pediatricians, family physicians, and nurse practitioners give new, developmentally
 - appropriate books to children, ages 6 months through 5 years, and advise parents about the importance of reading aloud.
- During the preschool years, children served by Reach Out and Read score three to six months ahead of their non-Reach Out and Read peers on vocabulary tests, preparing them to start school on target.
- Cost is \$2,000 per year for books for each physician.
