What is 360 Blueprint?

Reading and Relationships

- Collaborative effort with Law Enforcement, WCSD, Local Businesses and churches.
- Investing time and resources into schools and students that have been identified as at-risk.
- 8 schools participating in Sparks and Reno
 - 5 schools in Sparks-Alice Maxwell, Greenbrae, Robert Mitchell, Katherine Dunn and Lincoln Park.

Currently have 8 Sparks Police Officers in the program

360 Blueprint cont.

Two components of 360 Blueprint

Reading- Why is it important?

- Read by grade three initiative.
- 360 Blueprint understands the importance of investing time and resources into schools and students that have been identified as at-risk.

Relationships- 360 Blueprint in the relationship component will use a curriculum to creatively address peer pressure and behaviors unbecoming. Good relationship with the community will help combat these obstacles we face as a community with our kids to give them a brighter future.

How does 360 Blueprint work?

- To place caring, competent, and consistent adults as mentors in the schools.
- To have mentees demonstrate an increase in pro-social skills or competencies that protect them from a wide range of risk-taking behaviors that lead to school dropout, substance use/abuse, violence/gang activity, and out-of-wedlock pregnancy.
- To have mentees demonstrate an increase in reading and a stronger commitment to school thus reducing academic failure and school drop out.
- To have mentees master new skills and develop a sense of belonging and bonding among peers, family and community thus reducing anti-social behavior and alienation within their environments.



PURPOSE

Ι.

The purpose of this Media Guide is to provide general guidelines concerning how the Sparks Police share and disseminate information with the media and our community. Our philosophy is to operate in a cooperative partnership with our community and the media. We serve our community in part through collecting and disseminating information. Releasing information to the media and informing our community is important. A goal of communicating with the media and informing our community is to provide timely, accurate and relevant information. We will balance the need to inform while protecting the integrity of an investigation and being sensitive to victims.

II. NEWS RELEASE

A News Release is intended to inform the public and media of a situation or incident related to: Homicides, Robberies, Battery with a Deadly Weapon, Traffic Crashes, Road Closures, Hazards, Property Crimes resulting in significant property damage or loss, Serial Crimes, Child Abductions or Attempted Child Abduction, Officer Involved Shooting, Suspicious Death or anything else of significant media and public interest. A News Release will be listed and published in one of four categories depending on the content of the information.

<u>Traffic Advisory</u>: Traffic-related incident affecting traffic flow or restrictions in Sparks such as; road closures, roadway hazards or a crash/collision.

<u>News Release</u>: News or information related to a Sparks Police investigation, arrest, crime trend, community event or information not related to traffic or imminent threat to public safety.

<u>Safety Alert</u>: Information concerning a potential or actual imminent threat to public safety such as; active shooter, evacuations for safety, dangerous suspect on the loose, or any incident where rapid notification is needed to protect our community.

<u>Repeat Offender Program</u>: Any incident or information related solely to the Repeat Offender Program such as an arrest, case conclusion or other ROP-related information.

Sparks Retail Theft Summons Program

HOW IT WORKS:


Once the shoplifter is apprehended, a determination is made as to whether the suspect meets the summons criteria or requires police response. If the criteria are met, the LPO then:

- Logs on to the dedicated and secure reporting system and completes a report that is automatically sent to the Sparks Police Department
- Releases the suspect with a summons
- Receives a free official police report by email once reviewed and approved by the Sparks Police Department.

BENEFITS:

Retailers with an internet – enabled PC, tablet or smart phone can implement the browser – based program in order to:

- Reduce time spent processing shoplifting incidents by as much as 90%
- Concentrate on loss prevention rather than incident processing when they redeploy LPOs to the sales floor faster
- Improve relationships with local law enforcement to sharply reduce on scene calls for service
- Get faster response times to situations where local law enforcement is indeed needed at the scene
- Increase prosecution rates by providing law enforcement more accurate, consistent information

Neighborhood Watch

Neighborhood Crime Facts:

Burglary, auto theft, domestic violence, theft and graffiti are the most prevalent neighborhood crimes

Household burglary is a crime of opportunity, the easiest to prevent, but the hardest to solve.

Most burglar are either juveniles or young adults, who need to support a drug habit.

A majority of residential burglaries occur because someone has left a door or window unsecured.

Half of all home burglaries occur during the day.

People who interrupt a burglary risk being seriously injured.

Goals:

Sparks Police Neighborhood Watch Program works to reduce in neighborhoods. An active neighborhood Watch program can effectively reduce crimes to homes and improve safety in neighborhoods.

Step #1 – First ask your neighbors



Crime Free Multi-Housing Program

What is Crime Free Multi-Housing ?

A unique 3-phase program which began in Mesa, Arizona in 1992 to combat escalating crime in rental communities.

This innovative program has grown to 47 states as well as Canada and over a dozen overseas countries.



Why Criminal Prefer Rentals:

They are often very transitory in nature

They want to blend into a larger crowd

Asset-Forfeiture Laws do not generally apply

If necessary, they can move away quickly

The Three Phases:

- PHASE 1 Property Managers and/or Owners **MUST** participate in an 8 hour training for the CFMH Program.
- PHASE 2 Apartment Complexes must meet the minimum CPTED requirements. Implement a CFMH Addendum to Rental/Lease Application and Criminal Background Check of *ALL* adults tenants.
- PHASE 3 Provide a yearly Crime Free social / gathering / BBQ and maintain requirements of certification.
