

December 17, 2017 - VA, Department Health & Human Services, **Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)** announced inaugural Mayor's Challenge to prevent suicide among service members, veterans and their families.

VA & SAMHSA selected 7 cities to participate in a policy academy process and subsequent activities over 2018. Las Vegas was among the cities selected.

Selection based on veteran population data, suicide prevalence rates and the capacity of the city to lead the way with the goal of the Mayor's Challenge to eliminate suicide by using a comprehensive approach to suicide prevention.

NDVS held one of the position's on the Las Vegas Mayor's Challenge Team along with a collaborative team consisting of municipal, military and other community stakeholders.

NDVS is now excited to announce SAMHSA/ VA has selected Reno/Sparks as 1 of the 7 next cities invited to participate in the 2nd Annual 2019 SAMHSA Mayor's Challenge.





- Strengthen the capacity of your interagency military and civilian team of leaders to prevent and reduce suicide among Service Members, Veterans, and Families (SMVF)
- Deepen the development of your local implementation plan to align with the National Strategy for the Prevention of Veteran Suicide
- Acquire a deeper familiarity with the issues surrounding suicide prevention for SMVF

Truckee Meadows Team Action Items

Long Term Action Items:

- Develop a "Street Team" to promote firearms safety within the firearms community
- Advocate for policy change at highest level; "Top Down" policy change with no consequences for seeking help
- Advocate to medical boards to monitor physicians training on suicide prevention
- Increase Military Cultural Awareness Training

Short Term Actions Items:

- Expand Ask the Question- Military status, how are we identifying our military population & family members?
- Establish a interagency link with law enforcement for at-risk Service Members, Veterans & Family Members (SMVF) within Sparks, Reno, Washoe & Tribal Colonies
- Raise Awareness of old medication disposal options in communities
