

The U.S. Department of Labor has designated November 11-17, 2019 as National Apprenticeship Week. The North American Building Trades Unions and its signatory contractors have funded and operated a skilled craft apprenticeship system for over 100 years.

To celebrate this event the apprenticeship programs of select Northern Nevada Building and Construction Trades unions and their associated contractors invite elected officials along with business and industry personnel to visit their joint apprenticeship training centers to see what the centers have to offer and why apprenticeship has earned the name the "other four-year degree"

Northern Nevada apprenticeship programs in the building and construction trades have been assessed for college credit and are accredited through TMCC in which apprentices earn a certificate that may be applied toward an associates or bachelor's degree. Some of the apprenticeship programs have worked with TMCC on additional curriculum so that when they complete their apprenticeship, they will have obtained an associate degree. Nearly 9 out of 10 apprentices are employed after finishing their apprenticeship.

Apprenticeship and workplace-based training creates industry driven and flexible training solutions to meet national and local needs. It is an "earn while you learn" system that offers people of all ages the chance to learn from construction industry professionals. When individuals complete the apprenticeship program, they obtain a portable, nationally recognized credential that they can take anywhere in the country. Apprentices average starting wage \$15 to \$20 per hour and workers will earn an average of \$300,000 more over their lifetime then their non-apprentice peers.

Currently in Nevada there are 71 registered apprenticeship programs, 5,786 registered apprentices, 5,486 are men and 300 are women. Most construction trades journeymen retire between the ages of 55 to 62. In the next 10 years we may lose half of our skilled trained workforce. This will create an even larger shortage of skilled construction trades but, at the same time creates a great opportunity to train new people to take over these high paying in demand positions.

Benefits of apprenticeship include helping to recruit and develop a highly skilled workforce which improves productivity and the bottom line. Apprenticeship reduce turnover costs and increase employee retention. Per the US Department of Labor for every dollar spent on apprenticeship, employers get approximately \$1.50 in ROI.




Our Apprenticeship Numbers Continue to Show Strong Growth in FY 2018

CONSTRUCTION CRAFT LABORERS

Laborers work many roles on construction projects, such as flagging, material handling, demolition, excavation, pipe laying & concrete cutting.

HEAT & FROST INSULATORS

Insulators apply insulation and protective finishes on high & low-temperature surfaces. Typical job sites are hospitals, power plants and schools.

NV ENERGY APPRENTICESHIPS

These apprenticeships include customer service, electricians, linemen, fitters & welders, gas pressure operators, and meter technicians.

PAINTERS & ALLIED TRADES

These pros include painters, drywall finishers, wall & floor coverers, glaziers, glass workers, sign makers, and display workers.

PLUMBERS & PIPEFITTERS

Plumbers install & maintain plumbing and drainage systems, while pipe-fitters install piping to convey air, gas or liquids. HVAC techs work on heating & cooling.

STATIONARY ENGINEERS

Stationary engineers operate & maintain equipment like boilers, pumps and fans, compressors, automated controls and motors.

Apprenticeships range from 2.5 to 5 years. You'll earn above-average wages starting day one while you learn from the masters—in the classroom and on the job.

Apprentice wages start between \$14-\$20+/hr and rise at regular intervals. Most apprentices graduate making \$25-\$40+/hr and it goes up fast from there!

All of our union apprentices are earning FREE credits at an accredited community college just for being in the apprenticeship program. Some programs offer an associates degree upon graduation.

After graduation, apprentices go on to become journeymen, foremen, site & project managers, superintendents, instructors, legislators, and small business owners.

Each apprenticeship program has its own open application period, and some have waiting lists. Applying is free and easy—we suggest applying to your top three favorites.

ELECTRICIANS

Electricians plan, install & maintain electrical systems, installing wiring and other components like breaker boxes, switches, lighting, and voice, data and video cabling.

IRON WORKERS

Ironworkers install & move large girders, beams, rebar and other materials in bridges and buildings, on elevators, stairways, and balconies, and reinforce concrete in walls & roads.

OPERATING ENGINEERS

Operating engineers operate and maintain heavy equipment like dozers, cranes, motor graders, loaders, pavers and mixers.

PLASTERERS & CEMENT MASONS

Plasterers apply exterior & interior coating materials to building surfaces.
Cement masons install curbs and gutters, slabs, driveways and sidewalks.

SHEET METAL WORKERS

These craftspeople fabricate & install sheet metal for use in heating, cooling, ventilation, ductwork, skylights, and metal roofing and siding.

Construction Craft Laborers-Construction Craft Laborers work on roads, buildings, and pipelines. We place concrete, lay pipe, and rake asphalt. Apprentices start at \$15.37, Journeymen make \$25.45*



Electricians-Electricians, plan install and maintain the electrical systems for structures and other electrical components. Apprentice \$15.80/hour*, Journey Level more than \$39.50/hour*



Heat & Frost Insulators-Insulators apply insulation and protective finishes on high and low temperature surfaces. Apprentice \$16.08/hour*, Journey Level more than \$40.21/hour*



Ironworkers-There are several different types of ironworkers-examples are Structural Ironworkers or Ornamental Ironworkers. Apprentice \$18.00/hour*, Journey Level \$36.00/hour*



NV Energy- (Employer Sponsored)-NV Energy offers several Nevada State Apprenticeship (NASC) apprenticeship programs. Apprentice at least \$31.00/hour*, Journey Level from \$47.00/hour*



Operating Engineers-Operating Engineers operate and maintain various types of equipment; examples are dozers, cranes, and loaders. Apprentice at least \$19.86/hour*, Journey Level form \$25.00-\$45.00/hour*



Painters & Allied Trades-Along with painters this trade contains drywall finishers, wall coverers, floor covering installers to name a few. Drywall Apprentice \$15.34/hour* Drywall Journey Level \$30.67/hour*; Floor Covering Apprentice \$14.15/hour* Floor Covering Journey Level \$28.30/hour*; Painters Apprentice \$13.64/hour* Painters Journey Level \$24.80/hour*



Plasterers & Cement Masons-Plasterers apply and finish exterior and interior coat materials. Cement Masons install curb and gutters to name a few. Plaster Apprentice more than \$19.61/hour*, Journey Level more than \$27.94/hour* Cement Mason Apprentice more than \$16.26/hour*, Journey Level more than \$28.96/hour*



Plumbers & Pipefitters-Plumbers and pipefitters install service and repair a variety of residential and commercial projects. Apprentice base begins at \$21.00/hour* Journey Level \$32.00-\$42.50 hour*



Sheet Metal Workers-Sheet Metal Workers fabricate, install, service and inspect sheet metal items for a variety of applications. Apprentice approximately \$14.00/hour*, Journey Level begin at about \$31.50/hour*



Stationary Engineers-Stationary Engineers are not involved in a building trade. Rather, they operate and maintain physical plant equipment, such as boilers, pumps, fans, and compressors to name a few. Apprentice more than \$14.00/hour* Journey Level more than \$22.00/hour*
