

Proclamation

WHEREAS, residents of Sparks called 911 or non-emergency dispatch for help in emergencies and for other assistance over 177,000 times in 2020; and

WHEREAS, our Emergency Communications Dispatchers are the first contact for a person in crisis and are knowledgeable, highly trained employees who work closely with police, fire and emergency medical personnel; and

WHEREAS, the safety of our police officers and firefighters is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who telephone the Sparks emergency communications center; and

WHEREAS, when an emergency occurs the prompt response of police officers, firefighters and paramedics is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and

WHEREAS, Sparks residents enjoy a high standard of public safety because of the Emergency Communications personnel who apply their expertise in dispatching help to ensure public safety; and

WHEREAS each dispatcher has exhibited compassion, understanding and professionalism during the performance of their job in the past year.
